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Deadline for Woolsey Fire victims to apply for Individual Assistance from FEMA is January 11

THOUSAND OAKS, Calif. – The deadline for residents affected by the Woolsey or Hill fires to apply for Individual Assistance through the Federal Emergency Management Agency is January 11, 2019.

Residents can apply online or at the Disaster Recovery Center FEMA is operating at the Janss Marketplace in Thousand Oaks. The address is:

Representatives from FEMA, the California Office of Emergency Services, the U.S. Small Business Administration and other agencies are staffing the center. Residents of any of the designated counties – Los Angeles, San Diego, Santa Barbara and Ventura – can seek help at the Thousand Oaks DRC.

Before visiting a DRC, fire victims are encouraged to apply online at [DisasterAssistance.gov](https://www.DisasterAssistance.gov) or by phone at **800-621-3362 or (TTY) 800-462-7585**. Applicants who use 711 or Video Relay Service may call **800-621-3362**.

The toll-free numbers are open 7 a.m. to 10 p.m. PST seven days a week and multilingual options are available.

Applicants should have the following information at hand:

- Social Security number.
- Address of the damaged **primary** residence.
- Description of the damage.
- Information about insurance coverage.
- A current contact telephone number.
- An address where they can receive mail.
- Bank account and routing numbers for direct deposit of funds.

The SBA is the federal government's primary source of money for the long-term rebuilding of disaster-damaged private property. SBA helps businesses of all sizes, private nonprofit organizations, homeowners and renters fund repairs or rebuilding efforts and cover the cost of replacing lost or disaster-damaged personal property.

FEMA assistance is nontaxable and will not affect eligibility for Social Security, Medicare/Medicaid or other federal benefits.

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
