Application period open for no-cost debris removal program

VENTURA, Calif. - Ventura County is coordinating the application process for the California Office of Emergency Services Consolidated Debris Removal Program (CalRecycle) for Woolsey and Hill fire victims. The program is offered to Ventura County residents whose home was destroyed in the fires. Participation in the program requires property owners to submit a completed Right-of-Entry application to the County.

Right-of-Entry forms will soon be available at VenturaCountyRecovers.org. Hard copies of the application forms can also be picked up at the County Government Center and Thousand Oaks City Hall. Completed applications may be submitted in-person between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. at the locations below. County and City of Thousand Oaks staff will be available to answer your questions and guide you through the submittal process. - **Ventura County Government Center**, 800 S. Victoria Ave. Ventura, Hall of Administration, Environmental Health Division. This location will open beginning Monday, December 10, and will remain open until Friday, December 21. The application center will be closed the week of December 24 and will re-open after the New Year's Day holiday and remain open until the application deadline, which is expected to be in mid-January.
- **Thousand Oaks City Hall**, 2100 Thousand Oaks Blvd., will be open from Tuesday, December 11 through Thursday December 13, and then for the entire week of December 17.

There is no cost to the property owner for the debris removal – except for any applicable insurance reimbursement – but residents need to provide Right-of-Entry forms, insurance information and other important paperwork to allow CalRecycle to clean up their property.
