The American Red Cross of Ventura County will be holding office hours for Ventura County residents who suffered home damage due to the Hill Woolsey fires from last November.

Registration appointments will be held Monday, January 28 through 31 at the Thousand Oaks City Hall – 2100 Thousand Oaks Blvd., Thousand Oaks, 91362

- January 28, 29, 31 (Monday, Tuesday and Thursday) Noon to 6:00 pm – Park Room
- January 30 (Wednesday) Noon to 5:00 pm – Acorn Room

Registrations are available for all residents whose homes received major damage or were destroyed due to the Hill or Woolsey fires and who have not received financial assistance from FEMA or from the American Red Cross.

*Please note that the deadline for registration for assistance for both FEMA and for the American Red Cross is **Thursday, January 31, 2019.***

To qualify for assistance, all applicants are asked to bring both proof of identification and proof of residency. Examples of accepted documentation include:
